

World Week for Peace in Palestine-Israel: May 29–June 5, 2011 Joint action for a just peace convened by the World Council of Churches

For more than 40 years, Palestinians in the West Bank, Gaza Strip and East Jerusalem have endured the Israeli military occupation of their lands and lives. Day-to-day life is marked by the separation wall, checkpoints, house demolitions, ever-expanding settlements, land seizures and unfair water use. Human rights are denied through arbitrary arrests and an intricate web of restrictions that limits the most basic of freedoms. Israeli military actions and Palestinian attacks have caused thousands of deaths. Palestinians bear the brunt of the violence, but the bloodshed and trauma affect all.

Getting involved can be challenging for Canadian Christians. This is controversial topic, and it can seem like peace is a hopeless dream. So why bother?

Faith demands hope, and in taking action through prayer and education we offer support to the Israeli and Palestinian groups who are steadfast in their commitment to non-violent resistance to the occupation. Israeli groups like KAIROS partner Bat Shalom have asked us to remember that the occupation damages Israeli society too; Palestinian partners like the Jerusalem Centre for Women ask us to call Canadians to awareness of the grinding daily reality of the occupation. They ask us to work for a just end to the occupation and to violence.

Even in the midst of the everyday violence of military occupation and control, these Jewish, Muslim, Christian and secular communities call us to a hope beyond hope. What is our response?

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Events: Hold an ecumenical or interfaith Just Peace 101 workshop with KAIROS, or use study resources offered by your national church. See *www.kairoscanada.org* at Countries of Concern-Israel and Palestine. Hold a study series or film festival, or invited a returned Canadian ecumenical accompanier to speak (*www.eappi.org*).

Learn: Get to know your church's and KAIROS' policies and consider prayerfully how those policies call us to education and transformation. Learn about church and KAIROS partners in the region and about the ecumenical resources we offer.

Learn about the "Moment of Truth" Kairos Palestine document through your church. Written by Palestinian Christians for Palestinians, it also invites people everywhere to reflect on its witness to the realities of the occupation and non-violent Palestinian resistance to it.
