

Initial Group Lobby Meeting Outline/Methodology

- 1. Thank the Elected Official/Staffer for meeting with us.
- 2. Introduce yourselves (briefly). Confirm how much time you have for the meeting.
- 3. Offer acknowledgement, appreciation, respect and gratitude for the elected official's specific work. This can include the work the province has done to date in furthering TRC Call 62.i.
- 4. Provide a brief overview of KAIROS & the Winds of Change campaign.
- 5. The request: Support legislation that fully realizes TRC Call 62.i.
 - Mention you will elaborate in a moment, but first you want to know their thoughts on the TRC's recommendations and on reconciliation.
- 6. Possible questions you could ask to further the discussion and gain insight:
 - o What are your thoughts on the Truth and Reconciliation's Calls to Action?
 - What do you feel are key priorities to make reconciliation possible?
 - o What does reconciliation mean to you?
- 7. Our request: Make age-appropriate curriculum on residential schools, Treaties, and Aboriginal peoples' historical and contemporary contributions to Canada a mandatory education requirement for Kindergarten to Grade Twelve students.
 - Acknowledge the work already done by the province and where more work needs to be done.
 - Hand the elected official the leave-behind.
- 8. Ask how and when you should follow up with the Official/Staffer.
- 9. Ask who they work with in their own party and in other political parties.
- 10. Thank them for their time.
